

## Factsheet Defence Economy in Portugal


Business Activity and Knowledge - The number of identified companies active in defence is now 363 (350 previously - includes companies not in the BTID) and their aggregate sales decreased by 3.1% in 2020 (compared to 2019), more than that seen in the rest of the economy (down 2%).




Human Resources - Employment increased by 5.8% (including the effect of the increase in the number of companies), despite the crisis in 2020, and salaries rose more than in the rest of the Portuguese economy (3.6% against 1.2%), continuing to reflect the higher level of productivity.



Labour productivity: gross value added per worker € - 3-year moving average





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


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Research & Technological Development - R&D investment increased by 9% in 2020 and,

together with the number of people assigned to R&D activities, remains significantly higher as a % of turnover in Defence than in the rest of the Economy.



Internationalization - The weight of exports in the defence economy rose from 2% to 2.5% of the total in 2021, which means that companies in this area were less affected by the fall in international trade during the pandemic than the rest of the Portuguese economy.
